INTEGRATIVE REVIEW Findings:

- -Lack of interest in ADS utilization
- -Highlighted GAP regarding perceptions of people with dementia

THIS QUALITATIVE STUDY EXPLORED:

- -the experiences of people with dementia whilst a) at home b) attending ADS
- -the impact of their ADS attendance on the occupational participation of their primary carers, at home, and in their communities
- -and explored the perceptions carers had about the impact ADS
- attendance had on their care recipients

SAMPLE:

- * (n=30) 15 +15 who lived in their own home together
- *A multi-site study 8 ADS sites across Perth, WA.
- *ADS managers gatekeepers
- *Data triangulated
- *Trustworthiness and rigour established
